YEAR 5 UPDATE

The children have had a busy start to the new school year in Year 5 and are settling in well to their new class. They were excited to start their new topic this week – A Kingdom United.

In their topic lesson, the children became Anglo-Saxons and created their own Anglo-Saxon passport, thinking about reasons why they invaded Britain.

Some of them wrote diary entries describing what it was like to be an Anglo-Saxon, thinking about their jobs, hobbies and where they came from. During their English lessons, the children have been reading a version of the Anglo-Saxon legend 'Beowulf.' They have been exploring the text, considering their likes and dislikes, puzzles and predictions. The children even had a go at developing kennings to describe the beast, Grendel. In art lessons, they have enjoyed sketching artefacts found at the Anglo-

In the coming weeks, they are looking forward to learning more and are excited about their trip to Warrington Museum to discover more about Saxon and Viking invaders.

Direct Debt payments will automatically be amended, therefore no action will be required by parents.


