

WORLD BOOK WEEK

What a fantastic Book Week we have had this year! Many thanks to those parents, and grandparents, who supported our Reading Café on Monday. The week started off with the whole school being inspired by two books written by the author Steve Anthony: The Queen's Hat and The Queen's Handbag.

The Queen's Hat is about the Queen's hat being blown off her head whilst walking out of Buckingham Palace. The wind then carries it on a journey around London where many famous landmarks could be seen. The Queen's Handbag is very similar but involves a sneaky swan swooping down and stealing the Queen's handbag then flying over the United Kingdom visiting landmarks such as: the Angel of the North, Edinburgh Castle, Stonehenge, etc. The children have really loved the books.

This has been a perfect opportunity for each class to experience cross-curricular learning at its best! Linked to our School Development Plan target of developing the Geography curriculum, each class has worked on linking the book to their geographical objectives. Reception looked at Culcheth, Year 1 London, Year 2 the countries of the UK, Year 3 the physical and human features of the UK, Year 4 Europe, Year 5 South America and Year 6 North America. Each class have found out about the different landmarks and the geographical locations of them using maps and other methods.

To link in Design and Technology, the children have constructed models of the landmarks to add to a giant map of the UK and the World. Reception created a map of Culcheth for their electronic robot to be programmed to visit the different landmarks. It has been great to hear the feedback from the children about how much they have enjoyed the tasks.

Today, Mr. Duckett has worked with Year 6 to create animations using the artwork the different classes have created linked to their geographical work. They have worked hard to make electronic books to share with each class.

Thank you to all the staff for their hard work this week and their dedication towards making Book Week such an exciting time for our little Newchurch robins.

To help with family financial planning, please be aware, pupils in Year 6 will be going to Kingswood in October and Y4 will be going to Beeston in July 2017.


