Dear Parents/Carers,

Following the 'Funds Glorious Funds' campaign by Warrington schools, a meeting was held, on 9th May, by the Fair Funding For All Schools (FFFAS) Campaign in Warrington. The purpose of the meeting was to further highlight the uncertainty Warrington schools are feeling over the government's new National Funding Formula and to discuss further measures that can be taken to help raise awareness of the issue and convince politicians to think again.

Thirty schools across Warrington were represented, including Newchurch, which showed the strength of feeling regarding this unfair funding formula.

Under the new formula it would make Warrington one of the very worst funded areas for education nationally, placing us 141st in the country out of 150. Under the new formula, schools in the best funded authority in England will receive an average of £6,775 per child, while those in Warrington would receive £4,306 – a difference of £2,469 per child. Even compared to the national average, Warrington schools will still receive £439 less per pupil. This translates into Newchurch Community Primary school receiving the equivalent of £525,897 less per year than schools in the best funded area and £192,721 less than the average.

As a result of the meeting there are a number of events planned which parents/carers can get involved with to support the campaign.

1) National Social Media Action on Friday May 26

The National FFFAS campaign team are currently working on a few social media publicity activities which you and anyone else can sign up to. Details have not yet been finalised but are likely to include a 'thunderclap' around 5pm, ability to add a 'twibbon' to your Facebook and Twitter profiles.

2) Warrington Guardian photo collage of what education funding cuts could mean to Warrington

The school has been asked to provide a photo contribution for the Warrington Guardian to produce a collage in the paper to show what the education funding cuts could mean. It could be a picture of books, of a show, of a residential, of a sports or music activity.

3) Demonstration outside the Town Hall on Thursday May 25th

There is a planned demonstration on Thursday May 25th outside the Town Hall in Warrington. People will gather from 4pm onwards and there will be speakers at 4.30pm. The local press and local election candidates will be invited.
