READING

As you know reading is key to improving children's learning and opening opportunities for their future. We learn to read, then read to learn. Reading for just 20 minutes every day exposes children to so many new words. The more they encounter new vocabulary, and the meaning explained to them, the more likely they are to use it in their spoken language and their writing. On some recent training attended by Mrs Narraway the following research was shared:

- ❖ Vocabulary at 3 years old is an indicator for KS2 SATs outcomes
- ❖ Vocabulary at 5 years old is an indicator of GCSE achievement
- ❖ Vocabulary at the end of Year 6 is an indicator of future income

So with this in mind, please help your child to learn any new words they find in their reading. It doesn't matter what they read as long as they enjoy it! There will still be a new word to be found.

HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY UPDATE

This week the History and Geography subject leaders, Mrs Sizer and Mrs Toone, met with Rachel Burns who is the link governor for these subjects. The meeting gave Rachel the opportunity to look through all year groups books and discuss the strengths of the subjects and the movement towards history and geography skills being taught within each year group.
