CELEBRATION

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We had a visit from our school improvement officer last week. His role is to give us an external judgment and support on how well the school is performing. He is also an Ofsted inspector so the visits can be very rigorous! I am pleased to tell you that the visit went very well. Here are some of the comments captured from his report:

- A learning walk was conducted focussing on the impact of teaching on pupils' learning for disadvantaged pupils and more-able pupils. The evidence presented and the workbooks and lessons checked by the LP indicate this aspect of the school's work could be evaluated as outstanding because:
- teachers plan challenging lessons that engage all learners. Teachers model their introductions very effectively and as a result, pupils know what to do and work productively. Teachers question pupils well because they know their subjects in depth
- teachers and TAs check pupils' learning well and re-shape tasks accordingly
- TAs provide the necessary support and challenge to pupils. Practical/visual resources are used well to support learners in lessons. Classrooms are beautifully presented throughout the

- school; they celebrate pupils' achievements and reflect the interesting curriculum
- more-able pupils are provided with work that matches their needs and abilities.
- pupils work at a brisk pace and make strong progress to the learning intentions set by teachers
- workbooks in all classes from YR to Y6 show rapid and sustained gains in learning. They are presented well and reflect pupils' pride in their work
- the school's use of good quality maths resources ensure pupils grapple with mathematics and the word problems set are hard enough
- pupils edit and improve their work to a high standard in English and the quality of handwriting in all classes is excellent; it is usually joined and neat.
- Pupils' workbooks demonstrate excellent progress, which is sustained throughout all year groups and across different subjects including mathematics.
