Table layout	The children decided that they would like a restaurant style lunchtime set up with tables set out jauntily and red and white table cloths. The children would like to have the cutlery on the table with jugs and water available for them to serve themselves. The children were unsure as to whether they would like to have music playing in the back ground and so it was agreed that this would be taken to a class vote. The children were unanimous in calling the tables by the names of popular children's books.	This was agreed by a majority of 7/10 votes. School Councillors to survey their classes for a response to the playing of music.			
System for lining up and serving of food – trays or plates	It was suggested that rather than lining up and having a long queue where children could make wrong choices, the children should come into the hall and sit straight at their tables. Tables would then be sent up one at a time but they could get their drinks while they waited. Discussion was had about the use of plates. Children felt that trays were best suited to Reception and Year 1 children. Children agreed that they would like the middays to serve the choice of dessert like we do during Christmas dinner. Mixed classes arrangement and timings	Mrs Narraway presented a proposal for staggering classes: 11:45am Reception 12:00pm Year 1 and Year 3 12:15pm Year 2 and Year 4 12:30pm Year 5 and Year 6 The children liked this but also asked if they could have it so they had the opportunity to have lunch with other classes throughout the year. Children in Year 6 expressed concern that tables and chairs were being put away when they were eating and they didn't like it.	This was a unanimous decision and Mrs Narraway will work on a yearlong schedule for the next meeting. It was agreed that initially classes would all sit on the same tables but then as the system started to be understood, the classes could mix up and it would be called 'Mix-up Monday'. It was agreed that each class would be given 15-20 minutes to eat their lunch before clearing up would begin.
