The children are currently working in pairs to become experts of a particular European country. Our mission is to travel through 15 different countries on a European 'coach tour' where children will teach each other about the country which they have been learning about. To help explore more closely, we have used websites such as Google Earth as well as the impressive

RSPB YEAR 1,4,6

On Wednesday afternoon, the children of Years 1, 4 and 6 were visited by Steph from the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB). The workshops they were part of looked at how we can protect the species in our local area and ensure that we create habitats for the wildlife around us. The children took part in fieldwork and classroom studies which included generating data that will be fed into a national database, helping inform

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the RSPB on bird species throughout the country. The children were really engaged in investigating habitats and spotting species they had not seen, or noticed, before. Even the robin popped up to see what they were up to.

Mason Holland Y1: We were looking for birds and animals that live near our school.

Charlotte Smith Y4: We were allowed on the muddy grass to look for habitats. It was great fun!

We learnt about the planets and stars in our solar system and got to explore the exhibits. As well as that, we took part in two workshops to improve our skills to work scientifically. One workshop involved a carousal of experiments, allowing the children to test whether rocks were meteorites; learn about how craters are formed and explore how much we would weigh on different planets. ALTERNATIVE PARKING AND MORE POLICE ADVICE


The police advise **you not to park on the footpaths** around school when dropping off or picking up. This could cause an obstruction for pedestrians.
