

# Colouring Competition – May 2020

### When does the competition open and close?

The Cheshire Fire and Rescue Service 'Colouring Competition' is open for entries between May 15<sup>th</sup> and May 30<sup>th</sup> 2020.

# Who is the competition aimed at?

The competition is quite simply for everyone. There are four categories; children aged 0-8, children aged 9-15, 16+ and most creative.

# How many pictures can I colour in and submit?

Each person can enter one picture. There is three picture templates, so you can enter a maximum of three all together. There is also the option of submitting a picture as a family and/or household if you prefer.

#### What do I need to do?

Colour in the pictures as you wish. The image provides a template for you to be creative, use as many colours as you want and be expressive.

#### How do I submit my pictures?

Due to the covid-19 pandemic, we are only accepting online entries which you can submit as an attachment to an email or you can take a photo of the completed colouring in picture and send via email. Just state in the email which picture belongs to which person, family or household.

# When will you know who has won?

A panel of judges will make a decision who has won each category and all entries will be informed who has won by email on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> June 2020.

#### What are the prizes?

We will be offering winners an opportunity to visit any of the 28 fire stations in Cheshire which involves meeting a manager and crew, tour of the facilities and formal presentation of a certificate. Winners in each category will receive a golden certificate, while the 16 shortlisted finalists will receive silver certificates.

Please note that children under 18 will have to be accompanied by a parent or carer when visiting the station and supervision will be required throughout the duration of the visit.

Station visits will be organised in the future when covid-19 restrictions have been relaxed.
