


## RESPONSIBILITY

Teaching Children Responsible Behaviour will help our children to:


- learn that their choices and actions have consequences;

- 1. create an environment where responsibility is an expectation
- 2. become role models for the children in the area of responsibility
- 3. teach children to be responsible for their own actions
- 4. let the children know that responsibility is the norm
- 5. reinforce any responsible behaviours with praise
- 6. provide consequences for irresponsible behaviour to deter any future episodes



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
