The Rotary Shoebox Scheme started in 1994 when boxes of gifts were sent at Christmas to children in the city of lasi, Romania.

Since then the scheme has grown throughout Britain and Ireland and tens of thousands of boxes have since been sent to children and families in many countries in Eastern Europe. Our main distribution times are still at Christmas and Easter but deliveries are made throughout the year as required.

Countries to benefit have included: Romania, Moldova, Belarus, Ukraine, Bulgaria, Albania, Kosovo and Croatia

DELIVERING THE BOXES

Your local Rotary Club arranges for the return of the filled boxes to our Warehouse, the Rotary Shoebox Scheme Trustees, who are all members of Rotary, then arrange delivery either overland or by sea container to the children and families. Rotarians and/or our representatives in the country of receipt then supervise the distribution.

The PTA have noticed less donations coming in this year with it not being dress down days. We took this decision to avoid disruption to the learning atmosphere in school.


The Christmas fair is an important fund raising event in the school year, raising money for our children for such things as the playground and iPads.
