ANTI BULLYING WEEK

This week, we have been thrilled with the children's understanding of what bullying is. They recognise that bullying is: persistent, intentional and has an imbalance of power. On Monday, **Adrian Derbyshire**, **a gold medallist paralympian**, Olympic torch bearer and victim of bullying, visited Newchurch to share his experiences with the children. He was so impressed with the children that he has asked us to help him create Christmas decorations with an antibullying theme to adorn the Christmas tree he will be erecting in Chester Cathedral as part of raising awareness. This will be visited by the Royal Family.

Faye Pryce Y1: He had been bullied and he wanted us to tell someone, if it happened to us.

On Tuesday, the whole school joined together to share their commitment to living in a community that does not tolerate bullying and hate crimes. We set off 35 balloons with a message sharing our commitment to tackling bullying and hate crimes. Please check out our website to see the images of the event.

As you are aware, the children have been asked to spread the message of zero tolerance to bullying as geographically far as they possibly can. We already have children saying they can send the message as far as

On Thursday, **PC Kelly Meredith** praised Years 3 and 4 who with her, to explore bullying in society and the impact of this on people's mental health and well-being.

Over the course of the week, all the classes have explored different aspects of bullying which could occur: name calling, physical bullying, hate crimes linked to disabilities, race and sexual orientation. They have created anti-bullying raps, animations, poems, art work etc. The staff have been extremely impressed with the children and each year we can see the growth of awareness in them.

Elodie Walsh Reception: We have talked about making friends.

In addition, each class has worked on a minienterprise: badge-making, book marks, t-shirt designs, friendship bracelets etc, all with an anti-bullying message. On Monday, there will be a market place where the children can purchase the items and the funds will go to support a charity which helps victims of bullying.

HAPPILY EVER AFTER PRODUCTION

As part of Anti-bullying week, Year Five and Six were lucky enough to watch a performance of 'Happily Ever After' this Tuesday. The production was inspired by the children's book 'King and King' by Linda de Haan and Stern Nijland. This is a book based on a traditional tale which explores same sex love and relationships.

Following the performance, the children had a discussion with the performers, which allowed the classes to discuss mature topics, ask questions and explore issues within the play. The work, carried out by the children, educated them about a diverse range of people and the children showed real maturity and asked some very sensible and interesting questions.


YEAR 1 VISIT TO NEWCHURCH PARISH CHURCH
