PEER REVIEW REPORT

As you may remember, at the end of November we had some visitors into school. These were 2 headteachers from Warrington schools and an external advisor who is a trained ofsted inspector. Their role was to observe lessons, interview school leaders and scrutinise any self-review and school improvement paperwork. The point of this review is to quality assure the judgements of school leaders and to give any points of development in order to take the school forward. This is a nerve-wracking experience but very valuable to have just a high level of leadership reviewing all that happens at Newchurch Primary school. I have a copy of the draft report and I am very pleased to say it reads very positively. 
