### Internet connection

Over the last few days we have been experiencing some internet issues in school which has impacted on the provision of live streaming sessions. We have also had some parents contact us to state that they are having difficulties too. We are aware of work being carried out in the local area which could be impacting on this but would like to apologise if there are any issues which impact on tomorrow's learning. Hopefully, it will be business as usual when we return to school.

Just to make you aware, last year we engaged in an initiative with the Department of Education which secured us with a £11,336 grant to install fibre optic broadband in school. Hopefully, this will have a positive impact long term on our internet capacity.

### **Free School Meals**

For those children who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals and are not currently attending school, you will continue to receive the vouchers until Friday 5<sup>th</sup> March. We have been informed by the Department for Education that vouchers will not be provided over the half term holiday as this is covered by the COVID Winter Grant.

## **Safe Internet Day**

As you are aware from the work posted on Tuesday, this week we raised awareness of the need to be safe when using the internet, particularly in the current climate where children are required to be online more often.

It has come to our attention that some children are engaging with TikTok and this is concerning us. As part of our curriculum, we teach the children about the risks of engaging with social media, but TikTok in particular is an app which has unsavoury content which is not suitable for children of primary age hence the age limit of 13 years. We urge you to check your child's usage of social media to keep them safe.

### World Book Day (Thursday 4th March)

As a school we very much like to promote a love of reading and therefore we never limit ourselves to one day to celebrate World Book Day – we take the full week. We are busy finalising the activities for the children which will focus on engaging with different texts, authors and illustrators and most of all having fun! We will provide you with further details on our return to school after half term.

The children will not be required to dress up as a character for World Book Day so there is no need to go out and purchase a costume (buy a book instead) but we will be snuggling down in the comfort of our pyjamas on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> March. We can't wait!
