Dear parent/carers,

Well, here we are on the last Friday of the school year. It has been a great to welcome parents to the sports days and feel like things are beginning to return to 'normal'. The lifting of the restrictions on Monday 19th July brings with it further change and some level of apprehension. Whenever there have been any changes to the restrictions this has been reported through the media and then schools receive their own guidance set within the context of a school setting which we use to make decisions to keep our children, staff and families safe and well.

As we only have two days left of the school year, and taking into account we have had a positive case in one of our families this week resulting in Year Three isolating and working from home, we have decided to keep the current protocols we have in place until we finish on Tuesday 20th July. Therefore, please could we ask you to continue to wear a mask when entering the school grounds and observe social distancing as much as possible. COVID-19 is still out there!

Based on the government guidance and initial feedback from the Warrington School Covid Task Force, schools are expected to revert back to more 'normal' school practice in September, removing measures such as bubbles, face coverings, staggered starts and restricted mixing of pupils for assemblies and lunchtimes that were put in place in response to Covid19 during 2020/21. However, schools are being advised to still ensure that the following control measures are put in place:

- Ensure good hygiene for everyone
- Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes
- Keep occupied spaces well ventilated
- Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19

At this point we wish we had a crystal ball and could see what the situation will be in September to give you more details of arrangements. Over the school holidays, we will keep abreast of developments and give details of how we will operate prior to returning in September.































September start and finish times

Many of our parents have informed us that the staggered drop off and collection procedure is working well. We are very much in agreement. We have seen an increase in the number of children coming to school on their bikes and scooters; a reduction in traffic congestion outside school and also the children are calmer and more settled when transitioning into school in the morning. Therefore, we have decided to maintain the staggering of drop off and collection times but have needed to make some changes. The times for September 2021 are as follows:

You will notice that we have reduced the amount of time between drop off and collection times; there is now a five minute window rather than ten minutes. This allows for the return to the usual school times we had before the pandemic.

We have looked at the siblings across school and aimed to ensure that they are able to be dropped off and collected at the same time as each other, or with in a five minute period. Of course, there will be some families who we have not been able to accommodate within the timings and they will be contacted to explain the drop off and collection arrangements for their children. We will send out a reminder text of your times the week before we return to school.

Uniform

On 29th April, an act was passed in Parliament which required schools to follow new statutory guidance on uniform costs, instructing them to keep prices down. We very much support this as uniform can be very costly. We have tried to negotiate with our uniform providers, Cactus, regarding the cost of the uniform they supply but there is no leeway in price without there being an impact on the quality of the product.

The PTA met last week and considered ways we can support our families. Our Newchurch robins grow so fast and can often grow out of school uniform which looks nearly new. Often this is donated to the school which is very kind but difficult to store. However, we have an alternative plan. The charity shop in the village has agreed to accept donations of school uniform. We are sure you agree that this is a great idea!

Local Support Grant

The government has provided additional financial support for food and utility bills for any child of a family on benefits (full eligibility is included in the below link). All families that have successfully claimed funding under the Winter Grant Support fund and Local Support Grant up to the 19th June 2021 and who are still eligible will be paid this additional money - they <u>do not</u> need to claim again. Only new Free School Meals claimants since the 20th June 2021 will need to make a claim for this extended Local Support Fund. The closing date for new claims is the 30th September and the funding will cover food for eligible children over the summer holidays (split into three payments over the period).
