Yesterday, Year Five worked with Nina Jolly (a professor of the Arts from Liverpool Hope) and Tom Elliot (a member of the Northern Chamber Orchestra) to begin their 'Making Music Visual' project. As a school, we are very lucky to have been one of the three primary schools across Warrington and Halton to be selected for this project.

The project involves the children using an art package on the iPads to respond to Appalachian Spring by Copland in the style of Wassily Kandinsky.

In collaboration with Culcheth High School, two other primary schools and the Northern Chamber Orchestra, the children's work will be part of a performance at the Parr Hall in July. Their creations will be projected large scale onto dancers and the stage during the playing of music. What a great opportunity for our children!


To help with family financial planning, please be aware, pupils in Year 5 will be going to Kingswood in October and Y4 will be going to Beeston in July.
