Dear parent/carer,

As we approach the final week of the school year, we would like to share with you some guidance we have received this week and also the plans for the Christmas festivities. Here we go...

Suggested changes to the school calendar

On Tuesday, the Department of Education (DfE) recognised the work of school staff (and other children's services) since September. We are sure that you agree that the staff have worked tirelessly to ensure the children's return to school in September has been successful; however, the children have made it all worthwhile with their resilience and sense of determination to succeed.

The DfE have provided schools with end of term advice which states: 'To ensure that staff get the time off they need and deserve, schools may wish to use an INSET day, making Friday 18th December a nonteaching day and using the day for staff training, which could be delivered online'. The advice continues stating that 'teaching time must be made up at another point in the academic year.'

Following discussions with our Chair of Governors, we have decided **not** to close on Friday 18th December and maintain the school calendar we have set for the year. We have chosen to remain open as we acknowledge that any changes with such late notice would impact on many of our working parents resulting in childcare issues. In addition to this, the Christmas festivities planned for the children on the last Friday of the term would be disrupted and the children have worked so hard this term and deserve a treat. I'm sure you agree!

What if my child tests positive for COVID-19 after Friday 18th December?

If your child becomes symptomatic or tests positive **more than 48 hours** since being in school, there is no need to contact us. Instead, you should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Up until Christmas Eve, if your child tests positive for COVID-19, having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, we are asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation,

































as your child may have been infectious whilst in school. If this is the case, please can you contact school via email using the following email address: newchurch primary head@warrington.gov.uk This is the head's email and will be checked at intervals during the six days following the end of term.

If your child needs to isolate as a result of a positive case being identified, we will contact you in line with the school's procedure set out in the contingency plan which can be found on the school's website.
