



Design Technology: Mechanisms, Moving Monsters



We will build our own moving monsters using the following strategies:

- Develop more than one design or adaptation of an initial design.
- Plan a sequence of actions to make a product.

- use a range of skills to help them keep possession and control of the ball.
- pass and receive the ball, keeping control and possession consistently.
- make progress towards a goal.
- make good decisions during a game and know how to use space effectively.
- identify what they do best and what they found most difficult.
- recognise players who perform well in their teams and give reasons why they are successful.
- Think ahead about the order of their work and decide upon tools and materials.
- Propose realistic suggestions as to how they can achieve their design ideas.
- Select from a range of tools for cutting, shaping, joining and finishing.
- Use tools with accuracy.
- Select from materials according to their functional properties.
