ANTI-BULLYING WEEK

This week, our Newchurch Robins have focused on developing their understanding of the importance of having zero tolerance towards bullying and Hate Crime. Each class has had a rich curriculum which is highlighted in **Joey's** (our Y6 raving reporter) report on the week.

This week we have been learning about how we are all unique individuals and to respect differences in each other.

EYFS have been doing Random Acts of Kindness e.g. hugs, shaking hands and helping people when they are upset.

Year 1 watched a Pixar animated movie called For the Birds, then they talked about the characters' feelings.

Year2 read The Rainbow Fish. They made a collage by writing about how to change sad feelings to happy ones on a fish scale.

Year 3 talked about LGBT, discussing differences and what makes them unique and special. Year 4 have made posters and written poetry about racism and stereotyping.

Year 5 wrote cinquain poems about diversity. They wrote a class charter, which is like a Code of Conduct.

Year 6 looked at LGBT, hate crime and different types of bullying, so they could understand what is acceptable or unacceptable.


Y2 have made Pudsey badges which will be available to buy from Monday 12^{th} November at £1 each.
