Listening to others.

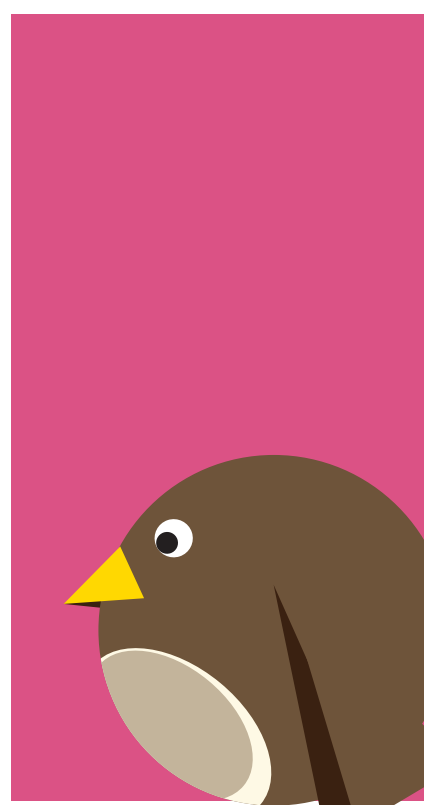
Valuing others, honouring others, holding them in esteem.

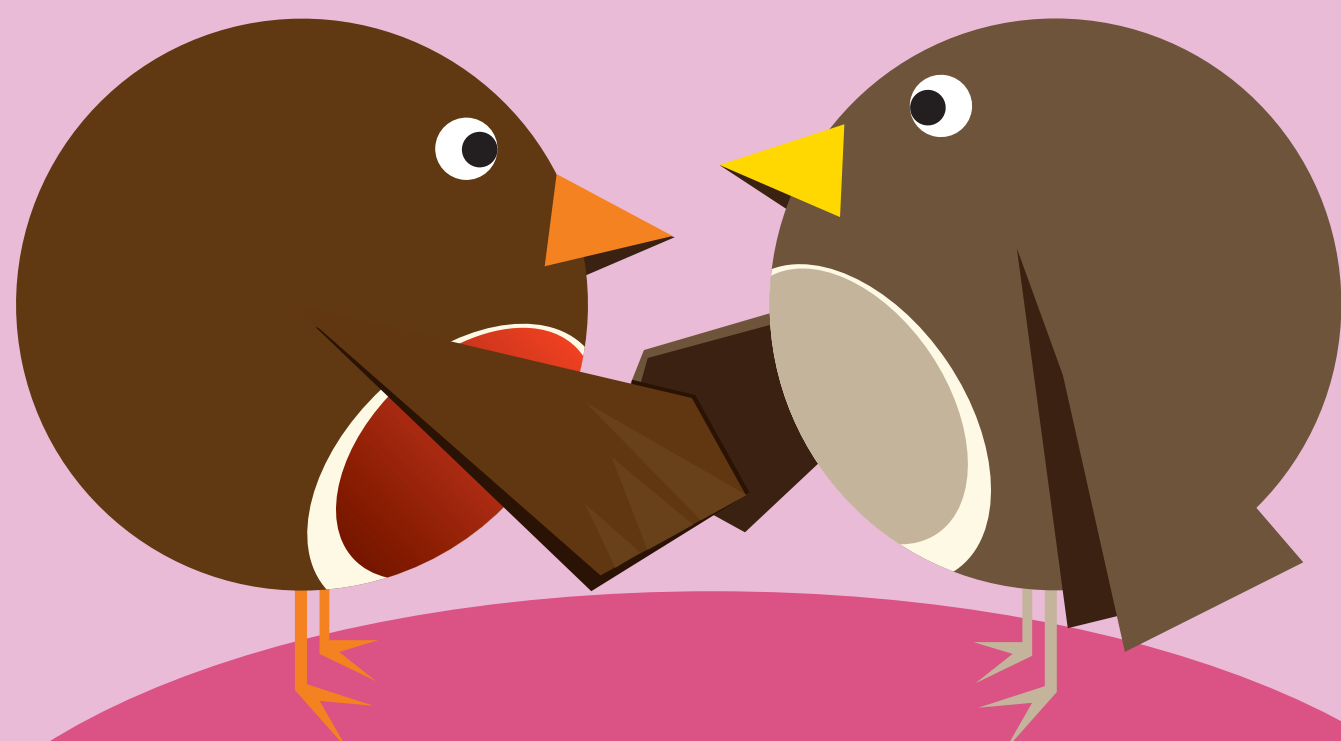

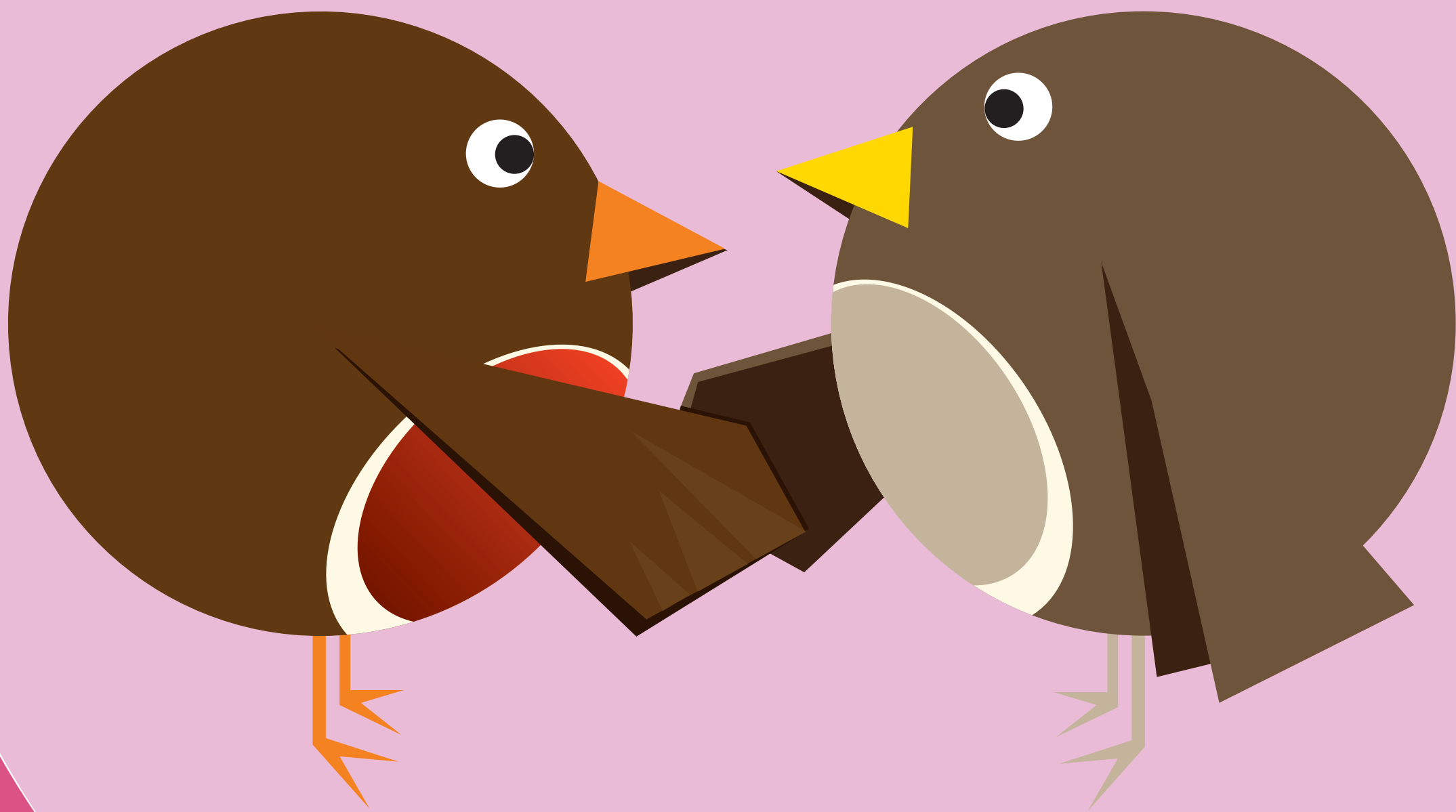
